EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE UPDATE

The MCA Executive Committee met in Chicago on October 20, 2013. Some of the topics which were discussed are outlined in the sections below. If you wish more detail on these issues contact either your sectional representative or the MCA secretary.

NFPA UPDATE

The Electronic Marine Chemist Certificate (EMCC) program has about 50 users and the requests for computers and printers has dropped off. It appears all chemists who wish to use the program have the computers and printers in their possession. The program appears to be going well and the main issues are with the printers. A problem with the monthly syncing to the server has been reported and a presentation at the sectional seminars will cover this and other issues with the program. In all it has been a great success.

Copies of NFPA 306, 2014 edition have been mailed to all chemists and trainees. Also, the latest edition of NFPA 51B (Standard for the Prevention of Fire during Welding, Cutting and Hot Work) will also be mailed to all chemist's this year. Electronic copies will be placed on the Marine Chemist web portal on the NFPA website. You can download them to your own desktop. There is a wealth of information for the chemist here. You can access it through the link in our MCA website (www.marinechemist.org) or through the NFPA site (https://portal.nfpa.org/MC/default.aspx). Remember, you must use your password previously provided to you by NFPA to access these documents.

Our monthly reports can now be done electronically and paper reports no longer have to be submitted. You can access the electronic file two ways. It is located on the MCA website under the Forms tab or on the NFPA Marine Chemist portal. Access to both of these locations are listed above. If you use the form on the MCA site a link to automatically submit the form to NFPA does not work. If you use the NFPA site you must configure the link to your email provider to automatically submit it. If you use the form on the MCA site you can save it to your desktop and send it as an email attachment. You must also attach a copy of either a paper

certificate or a PDF of an electronic certificate. You will need to print out a copy and submit it with the quarterly payment you send in the Gas Hazards Control Program. Hopefully, this will be a time saver for the chemists, especially those using the EMCC program.

MCQB

The MCQB is scheduled to meet October 22. Reports from the meeting included two items of note. First, the board certified Brent Campbell CMC 724. Brent was trained by Dave Bennett CMC 681and will work in the Jacksonville, FL. area.

Secondly the USCG reported to the MCQB that there were seriously considering implementing a policy which would allow their inspectors to enter spaces without having a Marine Chemist certify the space first. Your executive board is looking into this issue and will attempt to provide information on the merits of using a certified chemist prior to any entry. John Edgar CMC 686 has been especially helpful in providing the board with information to rebut this decision.

Finally, there was a discussion on the time required to conduct a quality competent person course. While the board has no jurisdiction on this issue, the general consensus was a minimum was between 16 to 32 hours.

PHOTOS

SCHOLARSHIP

Our scholarship has undergone some changes. The first change is that it will be called the Edward J. Willwerth Marine Chemist Memorial Scholarship.

The second change is that we have opened it up to high school freshman entering college, and to college freshman, sophomores and juniors. We have placed a maximum yearly limit of \$5000.00 per person and maximum of \$20,000 for an individual over their years of eligibility. The application criteria remain the same.

The scholarship form and criteria for eligibility criteria can be found on our website, so if you have a son or daughter or grandson or grand-daughter and they meet the criteria, I encourage you to have them apply. The application deadline is May 1, 2014.

NAVSEA WAIVER

A letter has been sent to NAVSEA requesting that all certified Marine Chemists be exempt from taking the OSHA 10 hour course to work on naval vessels. After several requests for additional information, NAVSEA seems satisfied and has stated that they will write a letter giving an exemption to chemists.
