Marine Chemist Association Newsletter

The Marine Chemist Association held a Board of Directors (BOD) meeting October 8th at MITAGS in Baltimore, MD. This was preceded by a sectional seminar. The topic of the sectional seminar was the standard safety designation of Safe for Limited Hot Work. Information on the seminar, board meeting and general information follow.

The presentation on Limited Hot Work was the third sectional seminar on this topic finally. The Board is returning to its schedule to provide two sectional seminars per year on one topic as in the past. We are catching up after the pandemic changes. Our next sectional seminar will be in Houston. More information on this will be provided later in the newsletter.

There were 10 chemists in attendance along with three trainers and one GFE. The turnout was better than expected although still below average. The Board is hoping that as we move away from Covid attendance will increase.

It has been many years since the Association held a meeting at MITAGS (Marine Institute for Training and Graduate Studies) and it turned out to be very convenient and the venue was very accommodating to the Association. The property is located close to the airport and runs a shuttle. Meals are included in the room price and the classrooms were up to date. The Association may consider returning to the property in the future for either meetings or sectional seminars.

The seminar at MITAGS went very well with multiple questions to the presenters. Additionally, the final open session remains popular to ask specific questions on any topic. All of the presentations are available to members to access on the website. The Board reaffirmed its stance of continuing to hold in-person meetings versus virtual meetings. The benefits of both methods were discussed and the Board believes that the in-person interactions provide a better experience for all involved.

NFPA 306

Don Raffo will chair a committee of Association member volunteers to reformat 306 in line with PI 34 and 41 and 45. The rewrite will not introduce any new requirements to the standard but will just be a reformat of the requirements of the 2024 edition. The motion was unanimously passed at the October meeting. A request for members to participate in this effort resulted in no volunteers other than BOD member L. Kuebler. This input will be for the 2029 edition. The closing date is June 3, 2026 for initial public input for the next edition.

The BOD will solicit a new group to consolidate updates to the next edition of 306. This will be a work in progress over the next few years. A request was put out in the newsletter and no volunteers have come forward. Don Raffo and Brian Axelrad will head up the committee. B. Albert, J. Hanson and L. Kuebler volunteered for the committee.

MCQB Report

The Executive Board of the MCA met with the MCQB following the annual seminar. The main issue the MCQB raised was that some chemists seem to be using a VOC or PID reading as a benzene reading. The general consensus was that a benzene reading must be taken with a compound specific instrument or detector tube. This was discussed and the board also believed that a compound specific or detector tube must be used to determine benzene levels in gasoline. Please be sure that you are using the correct instrumentation to measure specific compounds.

A discussion was held on how chemists would be able to test for benzene if the new ACGIH benzene level changes. There was no final consensus since the value was so low that there is currently no easy way to measure for it.

The MCA asked the MCQB for training topic suggestions and discussed ways to have a better line of communication with the board. This was a general discussion and no definitive path was determined.

NFPA Report

There are currently twenty-four trainees in the program, three new individuals registered in 2023. Three applications for certification are currently with MCQB.

Two foreign candidates have applied to register in the NFPA training program and the review process has begun within the NFPA. Eighteen recertifications have been done to date with four more to go in 2023. John Flynn and Chris Scott have both retired. Chris applied and has become the second Marine Chemist Emeritus.

It was reported that 23,063 certs have been issued with 75% of chemists reporting as of the meeting date. Hopefully by the end of the year there may be about 33,000 certificates issued, which is about the number needed to fully fund the program.

The goal of the sectional seminars is to provide information as to what is required in NFPA 306 so those attending will have the required information. None of the presentations are a mandate on what each chemist has to do. Each inspection is different and the goal is to provide information so each person has a good understanding on the minimum requirements of 306 and information to do a compete inspection including how to write a certificate.

2024 Annual Seminar Incentive Information

There will be another incentive to attend the 2024 annual seminar in Denver. However, this year it will be distributed differently. At the request of the MGHCP, a line-item submission for the incentive will be \$25,000. This will be split up to cover seminar and hotel costs between chemists attending the seminar. Last year almost \$24,000 was distributed. However, not all chemists applied for the reimbursement which was \$1000 per chemist. While it is expected that the amount will be about the same in 2024, it will depend on the number of chemists attending as it may be more or it may be less. The BOD did vote to end incentive payments 90 days past the seminar closing date. (This means you must submit the required information within 90 days after the seminar concludes to be eligible for reimbursement)

2024 Annual Seminar

Denver, CO. will be the site of the 2024 annual seminar from July 8-10 with the BOD meeting being held on the 7th. The location will be the Denver Sheraton Downtown Hotel, 1550 Court Place, Denver, CO.

2024 Budget Request

The Board will begin working on the 2024 budget request to the MGHCP/MGHCF at the end of December.

Member Requests

The BOD reviewed two requests from members. A summary follows;

The board discussed virtual vs in-person shipyard competent person (SCP) training and a request made by a member to provide a recommendation to NAVSEA that the initial SCP course only be allowed to be held in-person (not virtual).

This information was sent out to membership and several members thought that this recommendation was not within the mission statement of the MCA. The MCA consulted our attorney and the decision from a legal aspect was that this type of recommendation did fall within the scope of the MCA mission.

However, the BOD voted to not make any recommendation to NAVSEA on the type of competent person training it permits. A BOD member noted that any person can make a recommendation, on anything, to NAVSEA for consideration. The BOD believed that it was better for individual members to provide comments and not the Association.

The second request by a member was for the MCA to join NFPA link to allow all members to obtain access to NFPA standards. The Board believed that the cost to do this was excessive. It was estimated at about \$5000.00 per year.

Fraudulent Certificates

Larry Russell stated that he was presented with a copy of a Marine Chemist Certificate which appeared to be fraudulent and was issued by a person who was not a certified Marine Chemist. Larry reminds everyone to contact him on any issue like this.

Seminar and Meeting Dress Code and Information

The BOD reminds you that we are a professional organization and all members are expected to dress properly during meetings. Business casual dress is required at all seminars and BOD meetings. Additionally, when coming before any Board you are reminded to dress professionally and use appropriate language. This is especially true when going before the MCQB.

The insurance fund reminds every chemist that if appearing before the MCQB for any type of a review you are permitted and encouraged to bring counsel, documentation, or any information to make your case. The MCQB also encourages this practice.

BOD and Correspondence

As a reminder any emails, letters or other correspondence to the BOD becomes the official business of the MCA and may be included in the correspondence section of the minutes.

Marine Chemist Physical Ability to Perform Duties

NPFA sends the following reminder to Chemists who may not be able to perform their work due to a temporary physical limitation.

The NFPA Marine Field Service wishes to remind all Marine Chemists, the *Rules for the Certification* and Recertification of Marine Chemists, as amended 01 September 2023, Section II. Qualifications – General, Paragraph A, requires all Marine Chemists to "be of an maintain good character, and physically able to perform the duties of a Marine Chemist". In the event that a Marine Chemist is unable to physically perform his or her duties due to injury or illness; the Marine Chemist should be examined by a licensed physician and obtain a statement attesting to the Chemist's physical ability to perform the duties of a Marine Chemist. The General Medical Examination Form (Form No. CMC-MD-01) may be used for this purpose



An election is currently underway for the MCA alternate representative to the MCQB. Please take a minute to vote on this important position as this is the only member elected position to a committee for the MCA.

The MCA is also looking for a new Chairman Elect. If you are interested in serving the MCA please contact Michael Schmidt (<u>marinechemist642@aol.com</u>) for information. Normally, the MCA looks for someone who has served on the BOD or some MCA board and has some general experience on how the MCA works. To be on a ballot, the following information is from our by-laws.

Article 9. Nominations for Chairman-Elect.

The Past Chairman shall be responsible for overseeing the nomination and election process for the Chairman-elect. The Past Chairman shall seek other Members to assist in such process as is deemed necessary.

1. There shall be a sixty (60) day window for nominations for Chairman-elect prior to voting. The nomination period shall start on or about November 1st prior to an election year. On about January 1st of the year in which a new Chairman-elect is to be elected voting will begin and shall be completed by approximately March 1st. The Chairman-elect will begin his term during the annual meeting.

2. A candidate for Chairman-elect shall submit a letter to the Past Chairman, during the nomination period containing biographical information on the candidate's qualifications, and stating that the candidate is willing to serve for two (2) years as Chairman-elect and then two years as Chairman and two years as Past Chairman.

3. The Past Chairman shall compile and submit to the Secretary-Treasurer a list of those Members seeking election as Chairman-elect. Nominees will be listed alphabetically.

4. If there are at least two (2) candidates, voting shall occur in person and/or by ballot.

5. In the event of a tie or only one candidate, the Board will determine the Chairman-elect, who shall begin his or her service during the Annual Meeting.
